Public Comment Period

Public comment is an essential part of local government meetings. This period is an opportunity for members of the public to inform the governing body about their views. The meeting itself belongs to the governing body. The public does not participate in the decision-making but provides input, which the governing body considers.

The purpose of the public comment period is for YOU, the public, to inform US, the council, of your views.

To create an atmosphere where all members of the public feel that their voice is heard, and not overshadowed by the comments of a few, guidelines for public comment, in accordance with Roberts Rules of Order have been established.

There will be up to a 30-minute public comment period at the beginning of the meeting to address items specific to the agenda. There will be a second public comment period, up to 30 minutes, at the end of the meeting to address additional issues. Any items not addressed may be brought forward to the next meeting.

- Please introduce yourself, including your full name and address.
- In respect of everyone's time, comments will be limited to 3 minutes.
- Remarks will be directed to the Board.
- Your time is your own and you may not yield it to another speaker.
- Board members will respect your time, and not comment. Any inquiries will be noted and brought back to the following meeting and addressed as old business.
- The board respectfully asks the public to respect those in the audience, other speakers, and the board. As such, booing, hissing, or clapping and any other such demonstrations are prohibited.
