


























If there were to be a question on the ballot next November asking voters in the North Fork Fire Protection District to consolidate with Inter-Canyon and Elk Creek Fire Protection Districts and to raise property taxes by 3.569 mills to generate \$1,506,272 in additional funding for the newly formed fire district. The additional revenue would be used to hire full-time firefighters, EMTs, and Paramedics, update aging engines and equipment, and continue to provide ongoing critical training opportunities for staff and volunteers.

The ballot question would increase the current fire district mill levy from 12.431 to 16 mills. The mill levy increase would cost a homeowner about \$124.03 annually, or \$10.34 a month for a home valued at \$500,000.






Survey Demographics
